## The Risen Lord's message at Easter is challenging

The scripture readings at Mass these days and weeks invite us to sit up and consider how we can be disciples of the Lord in our times.

The accounts of the life of the early Church can inspire us as we struggle to live our faith in a changing world.

The two disciples who headed home to Emmaus thought everything was so changed from what they expected that they threw in the towel. Almost! In their journey of doubt and despair, the Lord walked beside them but they didn't realise who it was until he did at their table exactly what he had done at the table of the Last Supper. "And their eyes were opened".

When the word that the Lord was risen and alive spread among them, the lives of the early Christians were to change, too. Each and every one of them became "missionaries", i.e. they began to tell everyone they met about the Resurrection and about the new communities that were forming — and they invited people to "come and see".

So a vibrant faith community is one which is aware of the presence of the Risen Lord with us (and prays to and worships him); is confidently inviting others to join (of all ages!); comes together to encounter the Lord in the Eucharist (on Sundays, especially) and is committed, in turn, to walking with those who may be downcast or outcast.

The assumptions we made about being Christian in the past don't hold true anymore. A lot has changed. How will be faithful witnesses to the hope and joy of the Risen Lord into the future?
