### Parish accounts show people's generosity

The accounts of the parish for the year ending Dec 31st, 2022 were reviewed and approved at a recent meeting of the Parish Finance Committee. The accounts were prepared by an independent accountant and have been submitted to the bishop's office.

The generosity of parishioners continues to shine through the figures. Last year's offertory collections at Mass, online via the donate button and from the 'tap' portals in the church came to a total of €138,264 (127,008 in 2021). Other donations and bequests to the parish came to €36,763 and offerings at the shrines came to €44,006. Wedding fees came to €5,400. Parishioners donated €5,540 to the appeal for Ukraine and €3,945 to Trócaire's Lenten appeal. The other special collections for various charities came to €7,836.

The parish also received compensation from the parish insurers to help offset the losses incurred in 2020 during the pandemic lockdown. This came to  $\notin$ 44,064.

The parish's total income for the year was  $\in$  301, 576.

The total spent by the parish during the year was  $\notin 220, 540.$ ( $\notin 306,938$  in 2021) Half of last year's surplus of  $\notin 81,036$  came from the insurance compensation.

Repairs and maintenance of buildings (two churches, parish centre, three presbyteries) continue to account for the biggest expense ( $\in$ 77,940). Light and heat for the churches and parish centre cost  $\in$ 27,704. Insurance on parish buildings cost 20,279. Printing, post and telephone costs were  $\in$ 9,788. Wages accounted for  $\in$ 11,200. Levies of  $\in$ 12,076 were paid to the diocese for the running of the diocesan office and services. Equipment purchases came to  $\in$ 3,687. Proceeds of
