Easter – He is risen!

At Easter we celebrate for 40 days the extraordinary events around the resurrection of Jesus. All the Easter events have a pattern: someone witnesses that Jesus is risen; they tell others; Jesus appears to them in community and celebrates the Eucharist with them again.

As followers of the Risen Lord, we are called to do the same. We come to know Jesus, we share our faith and live it with others and we are nourished by the Lord at his Table.

At Easter, especially, we are reminded that our faith community needs the service of priests working closing with others who serve various roles in the community. So it’s a good time to think about the priests of the future in our parishes. Who will they be? Where will they come from?
