BENDUFF SLATE QUARRY

A memorial Mass was celebrated by Canon Martin O'Driscoll at the Benduff quarry memorial site on the 18th July last.

Benduff slate quarry operated from c.1820 to 1952. During its operation there were a number of workplace accidents in the quarry in which up to 18 men were killed. The most serious accident happened at 7.45am on the 20th July 1892 when the north face of the quarry collapsed killing eight men. Three bodies were recovered and five remain buried under the rock. The rock face was reported to be 400 feet long and 200 feet high. The collapse made a tremendous thunder like sound that was heard in the nearby countryside and as far away as Glandore.

The quarry closed for a while after the accident but was reopened again the following year. Many of the workers and relatives of the dead men were destitute and had no other work. The quarry seemed to be at its peak in the 1870's and early 1880's. There were between 100 and 150 men employed there at that time. In 1883 Benduff and Froe quarries produced 2,600 tons of slate which was over a quarter of the slate produced in the country that year. The importation of cheaper American slate in the following decades led to a decline in production at the site and it was in liquidation by 1892.

The men killed at the site in 1892 were Patrick Feen (62), James Feen (54), John Feen (25), Michael Tobin (55), Denis Dwyer (21), Daniel Donovan (16). All these men were from Barleyhill. Daniel Connor (50)

from Connonagh and John O Neill (13) from Froe were also killed in this accident.

The other men memorialised on the monument are John O Regan (44), Benduff who died in 1929; James Tobin (54), Barleyhill, died in 1934; Denis Dempsey (41), Barleyhill, died 1937; Patrick Donovan (64), Froe who died in 1873.

PARDON ME?! WHAT WAS THAT AT MASS?

The hymn shortly before the consecration at Mass in the context of the account of the Last Supper is well known - Holy, holy, holy Lord - but how is it relevant to that part of Mass? It seems to come out of nowhere.

The first few lines are from the vision of the prophet Isaiah in the Temple of Jerusalem and he heard the angels singing to God 'Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of hosts' (Isaiah 3:1). Three times holy is the Hebrew way of saying 'the holiest'. 'Lord' replaces God's name which people avoided saying out of respect. 'Hosts' refers to the Hebrews' armies, their strength. God of hosts recalls God's giving strength to his people so they could defend themselves and forge and strong identity.

'Heaven and earth are full of your glory' is from the same song of the angels heard by Isaiah, although with 'heaven' added. God's presence and majesty extend throughout heaven and throughout all creation, including in the church where Mass is being celebrated.

'Hosanna' means 'So, save us!', although by Our Lord's day, people understood it as a rather general religious acclamation.

'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord' recalls the coming of God the Son among us.

From Psalm 117(118), the last of the Egyptian Hallel psalms, it is also part of the Palm Sunday story, and in the Mass it prepares for the coming of the Lord in the consecration of the bread and wine making his offering on Good Friday present.

The Holy, Holy, addressed to God the Father, is a hymn of priest and congregation preparing for the consecration, conscious they are in the presence of God, but also conscious God the Son is about to be made present through the consecration of the bread and wine into his body and blood, making his

soul and divinity present also. The hymn also has a view towards the Lord's offering on Good Friday and so prepares us for the Institution Narrative of the Mass.

It's important we stick to the words of the Holy, holy as given to us because changing the words can sometimes make a nonsense of the meaning of the hymn, overlooking that it is addressed to God the Father, that it recalls the Lord's coming on Palm Sunday and his self-offering on Good Friday made present at Mass.
